



port. Landowners within the service area can expect to see a new line item on their property taxes next year. The details of implementing the agreement will be worked out over the next few months, but the MCA can now plan our future with stable funding for the maintenance and improvements to our community facilities. The MCA will continue to operate these facilities in essentially the same way we have always done.

Part of the Service agreement is that members of the community will oversee how the money is being spent. These people will be an independent group, not part of the MCA Executive. We have been asked for nominations by the Regional District. The group will probably be 3-5 people who meet with District staff and the MCA once or twice a year to review expenses, and plan a budget for the amount of tax to be collected in the next year.
